Part 2 General information

Section 1 Purpose

7. The purpose of this enforceable undertaking is to document the undertakings offered to the National Heavy Vehicle Regulator (NHVR) pursuant to Chapter 10.1A of the Heavy Vehicle National Law (HVNL) in connection with a matter relating to an alleged contravention of the HVNL.

Section 2 Details

- 8. The commitments in this enforceable undertaking are offered to the NHVR by Michel Saada.
- 9. This enforceable undertaking is given on the day and date that it is accepted and signed by the NHVR. The undertaking and its enforceable terms will operate as a legally binding commitment on the part of the person from the date it is given.

Details of the alleged contravention

10. On the 22nd of April 2022. Michel Saada Recorded False or Misleading Information in Work Diary. His vehicle travelled through the Willaston cameras at 1:26 PM and Globe Derby at 1:50 PM whilst the work diary sheet showed rest at Kilburn from 12.45 PM.

Details of the events surrounding the alleged contravention

11.	On the 22 nd of April 2022 Michel Saada incorrectly entered his work hours from Balranald NSW to Kilburn SA.
	Particulars:

- 1. The accused record in a work record, namely a National Work Diary on daily sheet at Kilburn from 12:45pm (SA) on 22/4/2022
- 2. Such entry being false or misleading as the vehicle was sighted by Safe-T-Camera at Willaston at 1:26 PM (SA) on 22/4/2022 and at Globe Derby at 1:50 PM during the period the accused recorded as being at rest. The distance between Kilburn and Willaston is approximately 45 km (33 minutes).



The details of any injury or financial loss that arose from the alleged contravention

12. There were no injuries or financial loss that arose as a result of the alleged contraventions.

The details of any notices issued that relate to the alleged contravention

13. Michel Saada received a letter on the 29th of September 2022 (Reference 4470) with a charge and summons to attend Elizabeth Magistrates Court.

14. Michel Saada is an Individual and hasn't consulted any company regarding this Enforceable Undertaking.

Section 3 Statements

Statement of assurance

15. Michel Saada confirms that he is committed to complying with his obligations under the HVNL and ensuring so far as is reasonably practicable, the health and safety of all persons that have the potential to be impacted by its business or undertakings.

Statement of prior undertakings

19. Michel Saada confirms that he has not been the subject of an enforceable undertaking from another statutory body.

Section 4 Acknowledgement

- 20. Michel Saada acknowledges that NHVR alleges that he has contravened section 325(1) of the HVNL.
- 21. The alleged contraventions are taken very seriously by Michel Saada, who is committed to providing a safe and healthy workplace to conduct his business in a way that helps protect the environment and the communities in which he operates.

Commitment to the ongoing effective management of public risk associated with transport activities

- 26. Michel Saada is committed to the ongoing effective management of public risks associated with transport activities within his business operations.
- 27. Michel Saada has a commitment to ongoing continuous improvement in how he manages risks associated with its business operations, including the review of new technology when made available.

Commitment to disseminate information about the EU to workers and other relevant parties in the chain of responsibility

28. Michel Saada is committed to disseminating information about the enforceable undertaking to workers and other relevant parties within the chain of responsibility, including senior and operational management, health and safety management team, Health and Safety Committees and Health and Safety Representatives, workers, and all relevant contractors and subcontractors working for Michel Saada. This information will be disseminated directly to the people concerned, if and when it eventuates.

Commitment to participating constructively in all compliance monitoring activities of the EU

- 29. Michel Saada is committed to participating constructively in all compliance monitoring activities of the EU.
- 30. Michel Saada acknowledges that responsibility for demonstrating compliance with the undertaking rests with him and evidence to demonstrate compliance with the terms will be provided to the NHVR by the due date of each term
- 31. It is acknowledged that the NHVR may undertake other compliance monitoring activities to verify the evidence and compliance with an enforceable term, and cooperation will be provided to the NHVR including providing details of workshops and training conducted for industry and community benefit.

- 33. As part of this enforceable undertaking, Mr Michel Saada aims to deliver strategies that focus on benefits to:

Michel Saada intends to achieve these outcomes through the implementation of the strategies set out below that will provide him with knowledge and raise awareness to assist him in continuing his work within the transport industry and providing an exceptional example for relevant personnel and highlighting the importance of complying with Chain of Responsibility laws.

Activities

Activity 1 - Completion of Fatigue for Schedulers - TLIF 0006

Scope

- 1. This unit involves the skills and knowledge required to administer the implementation of fatigue management strategies during work operations in a defined workplace in accordance with national and state legislation and relevant regulations.
- 2. It includes monitoring the implementation of fatigue management strategies, recognising breaches of fatigue management policies, procedures and regulations, and developing and assessing staff competence in fatigue management.

Activity 2 - Distribution of Informative Material to Motorists via Local Newspaper Advertisement

Scope

Design and detail a detailed summary of the Fatigue for schedulers learning's into a concise and easy to read advertisement, to be featured in our most popular local newspaper The Fleurieu Sun.

It will be aimed at the importance of filling out national driver work diaries correctly and the importance of fatigue management.

Details

A bit of information about The Fleurieu Sun - A South Australian family-owned and independent business, proud to deliver a jam-packed newspaper with quality, local news, sport and event coverage. Started off as a paper printing a 56-page paper but lately it goes between 64 and a hefty 72-page edition and it looks to keep growing. The largest reach and page count paper in the region. Their closest competitor has less than half their circulation and production. They have outlets all over the Fleurieu and beyond with some News Agencies in areas like Colonnades, Rundle Mall and Mount Barker. Murray Bridge and Glenelg have just 4 weeks ago asked them to sign up to sell their papers as they are getting so many requests for it from their customers. The Fleurieu Sun has now reached over 5000 copies, and easily over 14,000 readers weekly, easily eclipsing all other competitors across the Fleurieu. (also own the Eyre Peninsula Advocate, Plains Producer and recently new owners to many more articles within South Australia.) Contents of the proposed newspaper advertisement are to be provided to, and approved by, the NHVR prior to publication.

Timeframe

To be finalised within 6 months of "Fatigue for Schedulers" course completion.

Outcome

To educate, remind, inform and make aware heavy vehicle drivers and all general listeners of risks that arise when fatigue isn't taken seriously and professionally.

Costs

A T24 or T42 size add measuring at 9.2x26cm or 18.6x12.9cm respectively will cost \$625

Output

The Electronic work diary will allow the electronic recording of work and rest times and will allow for easier review of past work and prevent any future breaches.

A NHVR approved EWD from Log Master Australia will be implemented for 12 months.

After the 12 month period expires the NHVR will be notified if reverting back to paper based National Work Diary.

Timeframe

The EWD will be obtained within 3 months of acceptance of this undertaking and will be implemented for a period of 12 months. After the 12 month period expires the NHVR will be notified if reverting back to paper based National Work Diary.

Outcome

The EWD will assist in ensuring compliance with fatigue management and will reduce the risk of another breach.

One year subscription fee of \$100
