Part 2 General information

Section 1 Purpose

6. The purpose of this enforceable undertaking is to document the undertakings offered to the National Heavy Vehicle Regulator (NHVR) pursuant to Chapter 10.1A of the Heavy Vehicle National Law (HVNL) in connection with a matter relating to an alleged contravention of the HVNL.

Section 2 Details

- 7. The commitments in this enforceable undertaking are offered to the NHVR by Andrew Charles Allen.
- 8. This enforceable undertaking is given on the day and date that it is accepted and signed by the NHVR. The undertaking and its enforceable terms will operate as a legally binding commitment on the part of the person from the date it is given.

Details of the alleged contravention

9. On 23 May 2023, Andrew Charles Allen drove a white Hino Series table-top without fittings bearing on Princes Highway at South Nowra on a road and did fail to ensure that the heavy vehicle, its components and load complied with the dimension requirements.

Details of the events surrounding the alleged contravention

- 10. On 23 May 2023, authorised officers of the National Heavy Vehicle Regulator ("the Regulator") observed heavy vehicle, namely a white Hino Series table-top without fittings, bearing registration number ("the vehicle") travelling on Princes Highway, Nowra
- 11. The authorised officers intercepted the vehicle, spoke to the driver and inspected the vehicle, its components and its load.
- 12. Inspection of the vehicle's registration details revealed that the registered operator is
- 13. The vehicle's permitted width was 2.500 meters.
- 14. The vehicle was loaded with scaffolding.
- 15. The vehicle's alleged width was measured at 2.625 meters. Taking into account the applicable dimension adjustment, the vehicle's alleged width was 2.605 meters, an excess width of 0.105 meters.
- 16. The alleged contravention of the vehicle's permitted width resulted in a severe risk breach.
- 17. The authorised officers spoke to the accused at the time of the intercept. The accused made the following statements:
 - a. That he loaded the vehicle and secured the load.

19. Andrew Charles Allen received a letter on or about 24 November 2023 (Reference 9417) with a charge and summons to attend Nowra Local Court on 1 December 2023.

20. The current safety systems include restrictions on hours worked and compulsory breaks.

21. Andrew Charles Allen is an individual and hasn't consulted any company regarding this Enforceable Undertaking.

22. Andrew Charles Allen confirms that he is committed to complying with his obligations under the HVNL and ensuring so far as is reasonably practicable, the health and safety of all persons that have the potential to be impacted by its business or undertakings.

23. Andrew Charles Allen regrets the events that occurred on 23 May 2023.

Statement of ability to comply

24. Andrew Charles Allen confirms that he has the financial and operational capacity to comply with the terms of this Enforceable Undertaking.

Statement granting permission to use

25. Andrew Charles Allen grants the NHVR a permanent, irrevocable, royalty-free, worldwide non exclusive licence to use, reproduce, distribute, electronically transmit, electronically distribute, adapt, and modify and materials developed as a result of this Enforceable Undertaking.

Statement of prior undertakings

26. Andrew Charles Allen confirms that he has not been the subject of a statutory enforceable undertaking from another statutory body.

Section 4 Acknowledgement

- 27. Andrew Charles Allen acknowledges that NHVR alleges that he has contravened section 102(1)(b)(iii) of the HVNL.
- 28. The alleged contraventions are taken very seriously by Andrew Charles Allen who is committed to providing a safe and healthy workplace to conduct his business in a way that helps protect the environment and the communities in which he operates.

Section 5 Details of Injury or Illness

29. Not applicable. No injuries were sustained to workers or members of the public as a result of the alleged contravention.

- 35. Andrew Charles Allen has a commitment to ongoing continuous improvement in how it manages risks associated with its business operations, including the review of new technology when made available.

Commitment to disseminate information about the EU to workers and other relevant parties in the chain of responsibility

36. Andrew Charles Allen is committed to disseminating information about the enforceable undertaking to workers and other relevant parties within the chain of responsibility, including senior and operational management, health and safety management team, Health and Safety Committees and Health and Safety Representatives, workers, and all relevant contractors and subcontractors working This information will be disseminated directly to the people concerned, if and when it eventuates.

Commitment to participating constructively in all compliance monitoring activities of the EU

- 37. Andrew Charles Allen is committed to participating constructively in all compliance monitoring activities of the EU.
- 38. Andrew Charles Allen acknowledges that responsibility for demonstrating compliance with the undertaking rests with Andrew Charles Allen and evidence to demonstrate compliance with the terms will be provided to the NHVR by the due date of each term.
- 39. It is acknowledged that the NHVR may undertake other compliance monitoring activities to verify the evidence and compliance with an enforceable term, and cooperation will be provided to the NHVR including providing details of workshops and training conducted for industry and community benefit.
