### *Victoria Class 3 Heavy Vehicle Livestock Carrier Mass Exemption Notice 2019 (No.1)*

#### Purpose

The purpose of this Notice is to exempt a stated category of class 3 heavy vehicles from the mass requirements prescribed in Schedules 1 to 5 of the *Heavy Vehicle (Mass, Dimension and Loading) National Regulation* (the National Regulation).

#### Background

This Notice replaces the *Victoria Class 3 Heavy Vehicle Livestock Carrier Mass Exemption Notice 2016 (No.1)*.

This Notice is being extended for three years and the commencement date and operational period has been amended. No other changes have been made to this Notice.

#### Vehicle

This notice applies to a 'livestock carrier' which means a heavy vehicle or combination that is up to 4.6 metres high and that is built to carry cattle, sheep, pigs or horses.

#### Areas of Operation

A vehicle operating under this Notice may use the areas or routes as set out below:

TYPE OF VEHICLE	ALLOWABLE AREAS OR ROUTES
Any Livestock carrier	All arterial roads in Victoria
A livestock carrier that is a combination consisting of a prime mover and a semitrailer	All roads in Victoria
A livestock carrier that is a B-double combination	A declared B-double route

#### Conditions

A vehicle operating under this Notice is subject to conditions set out in Schedules 1, 2 and 3. The conditions included in the schedules include information on:

- Unladen Mass of prime movers, semi-trailers, B-doubles;
- Dimension limits;
- Axle spacing; and
- Operating conditions.
