Industry and NHVR collaborate to deliver info sessions in SA and Qld

Two recent information sessions for NHVR Portal training were delivered for CMV Kenworth in Adelaide and Mactrans Heavy Haulage in Brisbane.

The South Australian session, conducted by NHVR's Manager Access Roger Garcia, Project Officer Nick Gralton and Stakeholder Specialist Simone Reinertsen was to assist Class 1 operators to use the NHVR Portal to apply for permits. The venue was kindly donated by CMV Kenworth's General Manager Jonathon Crawford. Apart from industry representatives, officers from Department of Planning, Transport and Infrastructure (DPTI) attended, including Toni Caputo and Mark Crossling.

"As well as CMV Kenworth we also want to thank Steve Shearer of SARTA who assisted in the organisation of this day," said Roger. "All up we had 15 attendees, with some extremely positive feedback received," he added.

NHVR also attended Mactrans Heavy Haulage to run an information session with Robert Aitchison and Rahim Deen to demonstrate the features of the Portal – Customer Module. The session was to guide Robert and Rahim through the process of obtaining interstate travel permits for their Class 1 heavy vehicle movements.

"Previously Mactrans would obtain separate permits from each state," said Roger.

"Now, rather than applying separately they make one application to the NHVR for interstate travel permits.

"Robert and Rahim were both extremely impressed that once a combination was created and saved in the Portal, they could then recall the information to copy and reuse for an alternative application in the future.

"The Portal's functionality and ease of use was a pleasant surprise for them.

"Both of these information sessions have helped operators gain the skills and confidence they need to use the NHVR Portal."

NHVR now to process Class 3 heavy vehicle permits within SA

Class 3 vehicle operators travelling within South Australia will now need to apply for permits through the NHVR Portal from 10 April 2017.Previously intra-state permit applications were made through the Department of Planning, Transport and Infrastructure (DPTI) South Australia.

This will apply to any vehicle exceeding mass and dimension regulations that falls into the Class 3 category.

To apply for a Class 3 heavy vehicle permit from 10 April 2017, you will need to lodge the application with the NHVR. Applications can be lodged using the NHVR Portal. More information can be found <u>here</u>.

After kicking off in Brisbane last month, NHVR's CoR forums have continued to inform heavy vehicle operators and the supply chain around the country of their obligations under upcoming changes to Chain of Responsibility laws.

CoR forums have so far been held in various locations including Adelaide, Dubbo, Toowoomba, Geelong and Dandenong, with more to come in readiness for the new laws in mid-2018. NHVR Manager, Chain of Responsibility Michael Crellin said it was vital those who will be affected by the new laws either attend a session or access the fact sheets and other materials on the NHVR website.

"All those in the supply chain affected by the new laws need to ensure they understand their obligations by the middle of next year," he said.
