

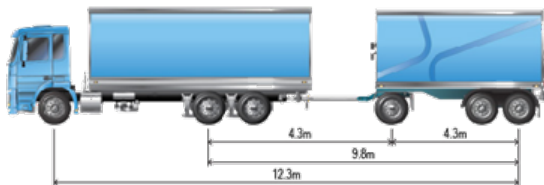
# South Australia – 23m Truck & Dog Notice Information Sheet

The purpose of this document is to provide an overview relating to 23 metre long, three axle truck and four axle dogs being included in the update to the South Australian Class 3 Heavy Vehicle 23m Truck and Dog Trailer Mass and Dimension Exemption Notice.

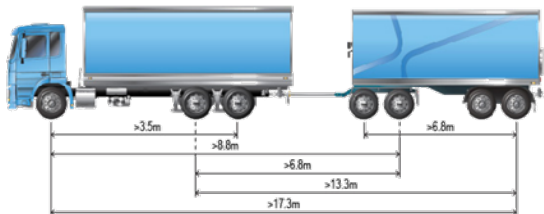
## What configurations are approved under this notice?

The notice previously allowed for a three axle truck and three or five axle trailers to operate on the approved network.

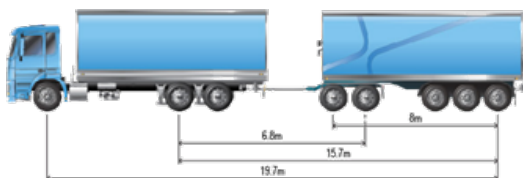
To operate under this notice, configurations need to meet minimum axle spacing requirements, as shown below:

## Frequently Asked Questions

### What access is granted under this notice?

The approved access for operations under this notice is reflected on the South Australian Government RAVNET and the NHVR Route Planner as the 23m Truck and Dog Network.

NHVR worked with various councils on the Eyre Peninsular to include their B-double commodity routes when carrying approved commodities.

These additional routes will continue to be updated as we obtain further road manager support.

### When would a permit be required and who do I apply to?

A permit will be required for any operations off the approved network for any configuration approved to operate under the notice. An application will need to be submitted to NHVR via the NHVR portal.

## How to apply?

To apply for new a permit:

1. Go to [www.service.nhvr.gov.au](http://www.service.nhvr.gov.au) and if not already registered, follow the prompts to set up an account.
2. Once registered, from the home screen, click on the 'Access Permits' tile on the top row.
3. Click on the 'Application Tracker' tile and then the 'New Application' button (on the right) and enter a permit name or reference for your application.
4. Click on the green 'Select Configuration' button and then click on the heading 'Truck and dog'.

5. Select the '*Rigid-truck and dog (23m – South Australian operators only)*' configuration.
6. Enter the length, width, height and mass details. Select the checkboxes where forward projection and rear overhang are required.
7. Click on the tiles that depict the truck and trailer; use the left/right or drop down arrows to select the axle configuration relevant to you (*1-2 plus 1-2, 2-2, 2-3 only*).
8. Click the check box to confirm the selection of the correct component.
9. Enter your VIN, registration and axle group details.
10. On the travel details page, enter the period for which you require your permit and the description of your load.
11. On the '*Route / area details*' page, click the '*Route Type – Area*' radio button.
12. Where connectivity to the network is required follow the steps 13 through 15 below.
13. Select the '*Layers*' tab and tick the '*Show all layers*' checkbox.
14. Select the '*GML Networks*' section and expand.
15. Select the checkbox for '*Rigid Truck and Dog 23m (SA Only)*' to show the network.
16. Select the '*Plan*' tab and enter the '*Area Road Manager*' name. Start plotting your journey (you may import a journey ID if you have one. To do this, click on the '*Get Route*' button and follow the prompts).
17. Follow the prompts to complete required details and complete payment for your application.
